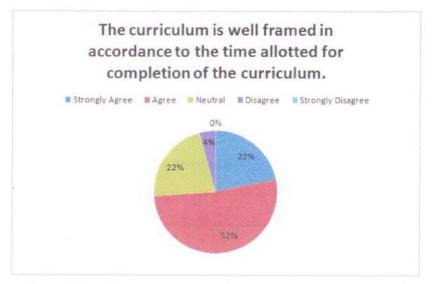

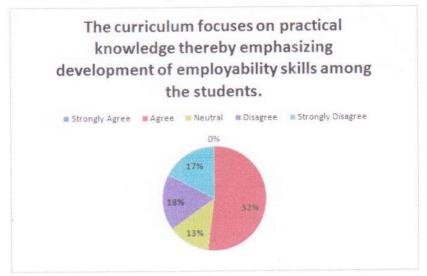

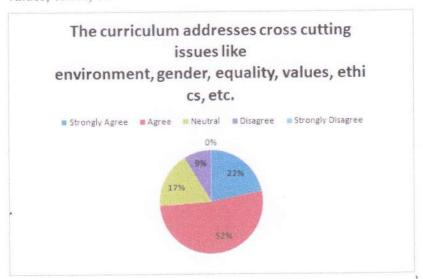

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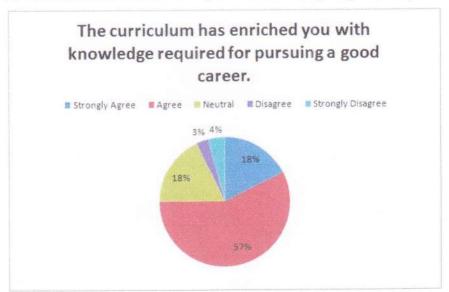

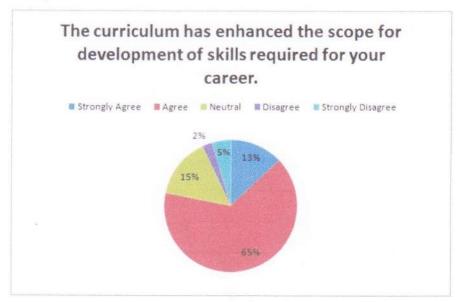

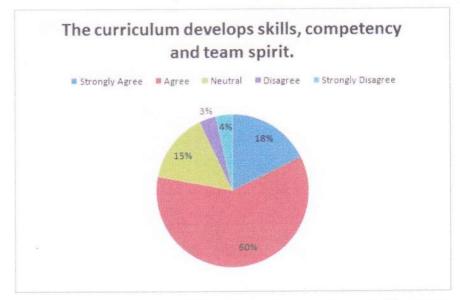

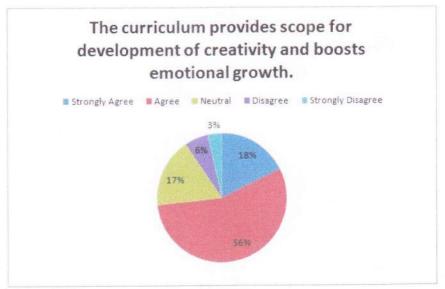

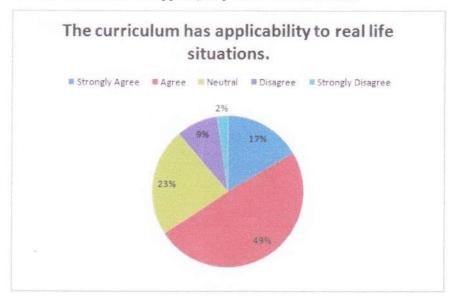

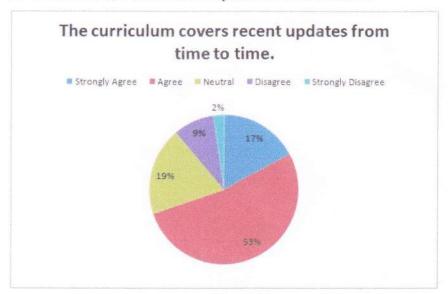

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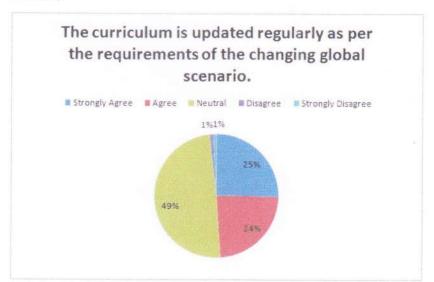

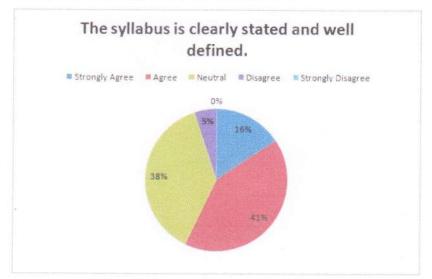

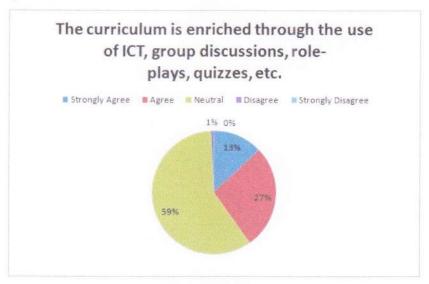

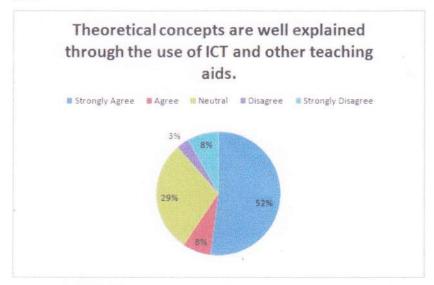

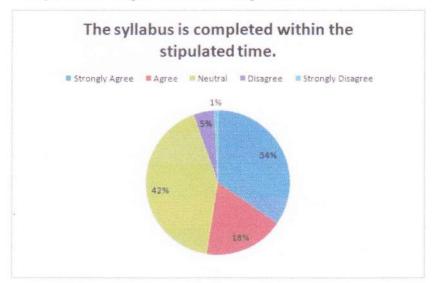

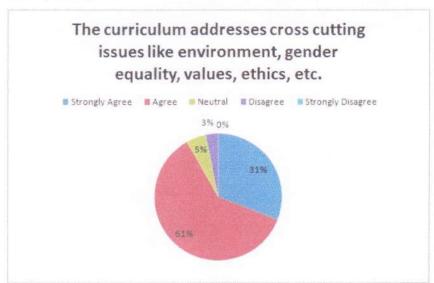

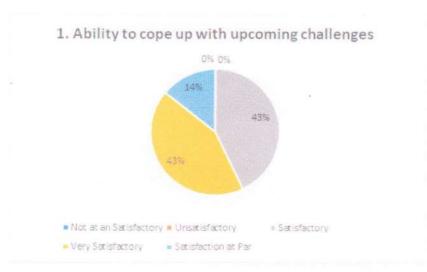

Report of Analysis of Feedback on Curriculum from Stakeholders

2018-2019

For the academic year 2018-19, feedback on curriculum was obtained from various stakeholders, viz, Teachers, Alumni, Students and Employers. The feedback was collected both manually as well as through google forms. After obtaining the feedback, it was analyzed for further action.

Since the institution is affiliated to the University of Mumbai, the institution has a trivial role in changing the syllabus as per the suggestions provided by the stakeholders. However, some teachers being the member of BOS, and some teachers participating on Syllabus revision committees and syllabus revision workshops, do forward the suggestions received from these feedbacks.

In 2018-19, feedback was collected from a total of 416 stakeholders, of which 23 were from Teachers, 217 were students, 169 were Alumni and 7 feedbacks were obtained from Employers.

Many Teachers stressed the need to have the freedom to contribute their ideas on designing and framing the curriculum and the scope for the development of knowledge as well as skills.

The students expressed that the curriculum is enriched through the use of ICT, group discussions, role-plays, quizzes, etc and that the theoretical concepts are well explained through the use of ICT and other teaching aids. Many students also expressed that the curriculum should offer future opportunities for research and career options.

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Most of the alumnus expressed that the curriculum develops skills, competency and team spirit, but at the same time they also expressed that curriculum has less applicability to real life situations

The Employers expressed satisfaction towards most of the work related aspects, however some employers expressed need for better communication and problem solving skills.

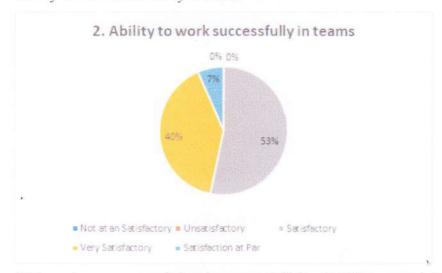
